The Skokie Lagoons is a 550 acre network of forests, artificial lagoons, channels and islands bordered by Willow and Dundee Roads and Edens 94 and Forest Way. The stewardship program directly tackles the problems of soil erosion, invasive species of plants, and litter. Individuals and groups are invited to participate. This program is conducted in conjunction with BackYard Nature Center and the master stewards of the Cook County Forest Preserve District.
